AN ACT REGARDING REDISTRICTING OF TOWNS FOR REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 9A of chapter 54 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after the last sentence of the third
3 paragraph the following sentence:—Notwithstanding any
4 provision of any special or general law or any provision of
5 section nine A of chapter fifty-four of the General Laws,
6 no precinct of a town shall be divided for purposes of redistricting
7 in the formation of representative districts.

As directed by the Senate and House of Representatives, the General Land Office has the honor to submit herewith the following report.

1. Section 27 of chapter 22 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after the last sentence of the third paragraph the following sentence:—Notwithstanding any provision of any special or general law or any provision of section nine A of chapter 22B of the General Laws, if no provision of a town shall be divided for purposes of this section in the formation of representative districts.
