**AN ACT REQUIRING RESTITUTION FROM ANY PERSON CONVICTED
OF VANDALISM.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General
Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Chapter 266 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
- 2 inserting after section 127 the following section: —
- 3 *Section 127A.* Any person convicted of the destruction or
- 4 injury of property under any of the appropriate sections of
- 5 this chapter shall as part of his punishment make restitution
- 6 to the extent of said destruction or injury.

The Constitution of the State

To be read for the purpose of the House and Senate
I. The Constitution of the State shall be the supreme law of the land
II. The Legislature shall consist of a Senate and a House of Representatives
III. The Senate shall be composed of members elected for a term of four years
IV. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members elected for a term of two years
V. The Legislature shall have the power to pass laws, to levy taxes, and to regulate commerce
VI. The Executive Power shall be vested in the Governor
VII. The Judicial Power shall be vested in the Supreme Court and the Inferior Courts
VIII. The Electors shall have the power to elect the President and Vice President
IX. The Electors shall have the power to elect the Senators and Representatives
X. The Electors shall have the power to elect the Judges of the Supreme Court and the Inferior Courts
XI. The Electors shall have the power to elect the Justices of the Peace
XII. The Electors shall have the power to elect the Sheriffs and Coroners
XIII. The Electors shall have the power to elect the Clerks of the Courts
XIV. The Electors shall have the power to elect the Clerks of the Senate and House of Representatives
XV. The Electors shall have the power to elect the Clerks of the Executive Department
XVI. The Electors shall have the power to elect the Clerks of the Judicial Department
XVII. The Electors shall have the power to elect the Clerks of the Legislative Department
XVIII. The Electors shall have the power to elect the Clerks of the Executive, Judicial, and Legislative Departments
XIX. The Electors shall have the power to elect the Clerks of the Executive, Judicial, and Legislative Departments
