The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARIES OF THE CLERKS AND ASSISTANT CLERKS OF THE MUNICIPAL COURT OF THE CITY OF BOSTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 218 of the General Laws is hereby amended by strik-
2 ing out section 75A, as inserted by section 1 of chapter 539 of
3 the acts of 1966, and inserting in place thereof the following sec-
4 tion:—

5 *Section 75A.* The salary of the clerk of the municipal court
6 of the city of Boston for civil business and the salary of the clerk
7 of said court for criminal business and the assistant clerks of
8 said court for civil and criminal business shall be as follows:—
9 clerks, eighty-two and one half per cent of the salary of each
10 associate justice of said court; first assistant clerks, seventy-five
11 per cent of the salary of the clerks of said court; other assistant
12 clerks, sixty-five per cent of the salary of said clerk of said court.

The Constitution of Massachusetts

Article I. The Legislative Department

The legislative power shall be vested in a Senate and House of Representatives, who shall be styled the Senate and the Representatives of the People of the Commonwealth.

The House of Representatives shall be chosen by the people of the Commonwealth, and shall have the sole and exclusive right of originating bills for raising revenue, and bills for appropriating money, and bills for the regulation of trade and commerce.
