### AN ACT IMPROVING ACCESSIBILITY FOR HANDICAPPED PERSONS TO THE STATE HOUSE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 8 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting  
2 after section 6 the following section: —

3 *Section 6A.* The superintendent shall direct the construction of  
4 access ramps and entrances for handicapped persons in the follow-  
5 ing locations:

6 (a) at the front entrance to the state house;

7 (b) between Doric Hall and Nurses Hall with the state house;  
8 and

9 (c) at the entrance to all hearing rooms on the fourth floor of the  
10 state house.

11 The superintendent shall also cause to be erected on the public  
12 streets bordering the state house signs directing handicapped  
13 members of the public to such special ramps and entrances.
