

HOUSE No. 4867

By Mr. King of Boston, petition of Melvin H. King for legislation to establish a commission on inner city youths. Human Services and Elderly Affairs.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE COMMISSION ON INNER CITY YOUTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 6 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting
2 after section 183, inserted by section 1 of chapter 266 of the acts of
3 1976, the following section:—
4 *Section 183A.* There shall be a commission on inner city youth,
5 hereinafter called the commission, consisting of five members, not
6 more than three of whom shall be members of the same political
7 party, to be appointed by the governor with the advice and consent
8 of the council, of whom three shall be city residents. Said
9 commission shall carry on a continuous study of the problems and
10 difficulties facing inner city youth. Said commission shall report
11 annually to the general court its activities and its recommendations
12 with accompanying legislation. The members of the said
13 commission shall be appointed initially for terms of one, two,
14 three, four and five years respectively, as the governor may
15 designate. Upon the expiration of the term of a member his
16 successor shall be appointed by the governor, with like advice and
17 consent, for a term of five years. The members of the commission
18 shall receive no compensation for their services, but shall be
19 reimbursed for necessary travelling expenses incurred in the
20 performance of their duties.
