RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF WILLIAM H. CLARK AND ANNIE M.
CLARK OF SHELBURNE.

1 *Resolved*, That, for the purpose of discharging a
2 moral obligation of the commonwealth and subject
3 to appropriation, there shall be allowed and paid out
4 of the state treasury to William H. Clark and Annie
5 M. Clark of Shelburne the sum of five thousand dol-
6 lars for loss due to a fire being set during the month of
7 February, 1949, by a ward of the commonwealth.
8 Said payment shall be in full satisfaction of all claims
9 against the commonwealth arising out of said fire.
10 No payment shall be made hereunder until there has
11 been filed with the comptroller an agreement signed
12 by William H. Clark and Annie M. Clark that the
13 amount, if any, paid or to be paid for legal services
14 rendered in connection with the passage of this resolve
15 shall not exceed ten per cent of said sum.
