AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE ADDITIONAL MUNICIPAL INDEBTEDNESS FOR CERTAIN HEALTH PURPOSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 44 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by inserting after section 9A the
3 following section:—

4 *Section 9B.* Any political subdivision of the com-
5 monwealth may borrow from time to time, in order to
6 finance any program for the prevention of pollution
7 and contamination of waters and water courses and
8 tidal waters, an amount not in excess of that approved
9 by the emergency finance board established under
10 chapter forty-nine of the acts of nineteen hundred and
11 thirty-three, and may issue bonds and notes therefor
12 which shall bear on their face the words (name of city,
13 town or district) Water Pollution Prevention Loan.
14 Each authorized issue shall constitute a separate loan,
15 and such loans shall be paid in not more than thirty
16 years from their dates. Indebtedness incurred under
17 this act shall be in excess of the statutory limit, but
18 shall, except as herein provided, be subject to the
19 applicable provisions of chapter forty-four of the
20 General Laws, exclusive of the limitations contained
21 in the first paragraph of section seven thereof.

1 SECTION 2. The members of the aforesaid emer-
2 gency finance board, when acting under this act,
3 shall receive from the commonwealth compensation
4 to the same extent as provided under chapter three
5 hundred and thirty-six of the acts of nineteen hundred
6 and thirty-three, as amended, including chapter
7 seventy-four of the acts of nineteen hundred and
8 forty-five.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
