In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARY OF THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOXING COMMISSION AND OTHER RELATED MATTERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 22 of the General Laws is hereby amended by strik-
2 ing out section 12, as amended by chapter 639 of the acts of
3 1957, and inserting in place thereof the following section: —

4 *Section 12.* There shall be in the department a commission,
5 to be known as the state boxing commission, which shall con-
6 sist of three members, who so far as practical have a knowledge
7 of and an interest in boxing, to be appointed by the governor
8 with the advice and consent of the council, for terms of three
9 years each and with like approval may be removed by him.
10 The governor, with the advice and consent of the council, shall
11 from time to time designate one member of said commission as
12 chairman. The members shall receive such salaries, not ex-
13 ceeding thirty-five hundred dollars each, as the governor and
14 council may fix, and the chairman shall receive an additional
15 two thousand dollars in salary. The members shall receive
16 their traveling expenses necessarily incurred in the performance
17 of their duties, and the commission shall be allowed such sums
18 for clerical assistance as the governor and council may approve.
19 The secretary of the department shall act as the secretary of
20 the commission and shall keep full and true records of all its
21 proceedings. The commission may deputize one or more per-

22 sons to represent the commission, and to be present at any
23 match or exhibition authorized to be held under sections thirty-
24 two to fifty-one of chapter one hundred and forty-seven. Such
25 persons may receive such compensation for actual services as
26 shall be fixed by rule or regulation of the commission, together
27 with their traveling expenses necessarily incurred in the dis-
28 charge of their duties. Two members shall constitute a quorum
29 to do business. The chairman of said commission shall devote
30 his entire time during ordinary business hours to his duties.
