RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION BY THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL RELATIVE TO DEFINING THE INVESTIGATIVE POWERS OF THE MASSACHUSETTS COMMISSION AGAINST DISCRIMINATION AND AUTHORIZING THE COMMISSION TO ISSUE INTERROGATORIES AND TO REPRODUCE EVIDENCE IN CONNECTION WITH COMPLAINTS OF EDUCATION DISCRIMINATION.

1 *Resolved*, That the judicial council be requested to investigate
2 the subject matter of current house document numbered 81,
3 relative to defining the investigative powers of the Massachusetts
4 Commission Against Discrimination and authorizing the com-
5 mission to issue interrogatories and to reproduce evidence in
6 connection with complaints of education discrimination, and to
7 include its conclusions and its recommendations, if any, in
8 relation thereto, together with drafts of such legislation as may
9 be necessary to give effect to the same, in its annual report for
10 the current year.
