AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A SEPARATE BARGAINING UNIT FOR COURT REPORTERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 3 of chapter 150E of the General Laws is hereby amend-
2 ed by striking out the third paragraph, as appearing in section 76 of
3 chapter 478 of the acts of 1978, and inserting in place thereof the
4 following paragraph: —

5 The appropriate bargaining units for judicial employees within
6 the provisions of this chapter shall be one professional unit com-
7 posed of all probation officers and court officers, a second profes-
8 sional unit composed of court reporters, and a third unit composed
9 of all nonmanagerial or nonconfidential staff and clerical person-
10 nel employed by the judiciary; provided that court officers in the
11 superior court department for Suffolk and Middlesex counties
12 shall be represented by such other bargaining units as they may
13 elect.
