In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred

AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Salaries and Expenses in
the Office of the State Fire Marshal.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of
3 the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified, to meet expenses for
5 the year ending on the thirty-first day of Decem-
6 ber in the year nineteen hundred, to wit:—

7 For the salary of the state fire marshal, forty-
8 five hundred dollars. [Acts 1894, chap. 444.]

(Appropriation 1899, \$4,500)

9 For the salary of the deputy fire marshal,
10 twenty-five hundred dollars. [Acts 1894, chap.
11 444.]

(Appropriation 1899, \$2,500.)

12 For the salary of the clerk of the state fire
13 marshal, fourteen hundred dollars. [Acts 1895,
14 chap. 452.]

(Appropriation 1899, \$1,400.)

15 For the salaries of the two stenographers in
16 the office of the state fire marshal, eleven hun-
17 dred dollars each. [Acts 1895, chap. 452.]

(Appropriation 1899, \$2,200.)

18 For the salaries of the two chiefs of aids in the
19 office of the state fire marshal, twelve hundred
20 dollars each. [Acts 1895, chap. 452.]

(Appropriation 1899, \$2,400.)

21 For the salaries of nine aids in the office of the
22 state fire marshal, one thousand dollars each; and
23 for the salary of a messenger, four hundred dol-
24 lars. [Acts 1895, chap. 452.]

(Appropriation 1899, \$9,400.)

25 For travelling, contingent and incidental ex-
26 penses, the same to include the services and
27 expenses of persons employed in secret investi-
28 gations and fees of witnesses, under the direction
29 of the state fire marshal, a sum not exceeding
30 ten thousand five hundred dollars. [Acts 1894,
31 chap. 444; 1895, chap. 452.]

(Appropriation 1899, \$10,500.)

32 For postage, printing, stationery, telephone,
33 telegrams, incidental and contingent office ex-
34 penses of the state fire marshal, a sum not ex-
35 ceeding twenty-five hundred dollars. [Acts
36 1894, chap. 444; 1895, chap. 452.]

(Appropriation 1899, \$2,500.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
