AN ACT PROVIDING LIFE TENURE FOR ROMEO MOSAKOWSKI, INCUMBENT OF THE OFFICE OF SHELLFISH WARDEN OF THE CITY OF NEW BEDFORD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any contrary provision of law, the tenure of
2 Romeo Mosakowski, incumbent of the office of shellfish warden
3 of the city of New Bedford shall, upon the effective date of this
4 act, be unlimited, but he may be removed therefrom for cause
5 after hearing in the manner provided by section forty-three of
6 chapter thirty-one of the General Laws.
