
By Mr. Beades, petition of John J. Beades for legislation to establish the board of boiler rules and registrars of engineers and firemen. State Administration.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE BOARD OF BOILER RULES AND REGISTRARS OF ENGINEERS AND FIREMEN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The board established under section 10 of
2 chapter 22 of the General Laws is hereby abolished.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter 22 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out section 10 and inserting in place
3 thereof the following section: — *Section 10.* There shall be
4 in the department of public safety but not subject to its con-
5 trol a board of boiler rules and registrars of engineers and
6 firemen. Said board shall consist of three members to be ap-
7 pointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the
8 council, for the terms of three years each, of whom one shall
9 be engaged in the field of boiler insurance, one shall be an em-
10 ployed operating engineer and one shall be a representative of
11 the boiler manufacturing industry. The governor shall desig-
12 nate the chairman, whose salary shall be not more than ten
13 thousand dollars. Each associate member shall receive as
14 compensation not more than seven thousand five hundred
15 dollars. Said board may appoint twenty-five district engineer-
16 ing inspectors who shall be responsible for inspection, exam-
17 inations and the issuance of licenses in accordance with the
18 provisions of chapter one hundred forty-six of the General
19 Laws. Said board may employ such clerical and other assist-

20 ance as it may require to carry out its duties under the pro-
21 visions of sections two to four, inclusive, of said chapter one
22 hundred forty-six.

1 SECTION 3. The members of the board shall be designated
2 in their initial appointments to serve for terms of over two
3 and three years, respectively.
