AN ACT REGULATING THE TRANSPORTATION OF DANGEROUS CHEMICALS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 148 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting
2 after section 9A the following section: —

3 *Section 9B.* Transportation of dangerous chemicals. No motor
4 vehicle shall transport dangerous chemicals on the public ways of
5 any city or town whose population exceeds eighteen thousand
6 persons. The classification of dangerous chemicals for the purpose
7 of this section shall be liquid natural gas, chlorine and such others
8 as determined by the department.
