To accompany the petition of George W. Stanton for legislation relative to the employment of boys over sixteen years of age during the existing state of war. Labor and Industries.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE EMPLOYMENT OF BOYS OVER
SIXTEEN YEARS OF AGE DURING THE EXISTING STATE
OF WAR.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or
2 special law to the contrary, during the existing state of
3 war, boys over sixteen may be employed, not later than
4 twelve o'clock midnight, in, about or in connection
5 with any manufacturing, mechanical or mercantile
6 establishment, factory, workshop, restaurant, or other
7 eating place, bowling alley, barber shop, boot black
8 stand or establishment.
