AN ACT

Making Appropriations for Salaries and Expenses in the Department of the Tax Commissioner.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned
2 are appropriated to be paid out of the treasury
3 of the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,
4 for the purposes specified, to meet expenses for
5 the year ending on the thirty-first day of Decem-
6 ber in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-six,
7 to wit: —

8 For the salary of the tax commissioner and
9 the commissioner of corporations, thirty-five hun-
10 dred dollars. [Acts 1890, chap. 160.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$3,500.)

11 For the salary of the first clerk in the depart-
12 ment of the tax commissioner, two thousand dol-
13 lars. [Acts 1887, chap. 342; 1890, chap. 160.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$2,000.)

14 For the salary of the second clerk in the depart-
15 ment of the tax commissioner, fifteen hundred
16 dollars. [Acts 1887, chap. 342; 1890, chap. 160.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$1,500.)

17 For such additional clerical assistance as the
18 tax commissioner may find necessary for the
19 despatch of public business, a sum not exceeding
20 sixteen thousand dollars. [Acts 1891, chap. 342.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$16,000.)

21 For incidental and contingent expenses of the
22 tax commissioner and commissioner of corpora-
23 tions, a sum not exceeding thirty-four hundred
24 dollars. [Pub. Stat., chaps. 13, 106 and 115; Res.
25 1856, chap. 74; Acts 1890, chap. 160.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$3,400.)

26 For expenses of the state valuation, under the
27 direction of the tax commissioner, a sum not ex-
28 ceeding three thousand dollars. [Pub. Stat., chap.
29 11; Res. 1856, chap. 74; Acts 1890, chap. 160.]

(Appropriation 1895, \$3,000.)

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
