AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE STATE SECRETARY TO AUTHORIZE THE SOLEMNIZATION OF A CERTAIN MARRIAGE.

1     *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would tend to  
2 defeat its purpose, which is to immediately authorize the state  
3 secretary to authorize the solemnization of a certain marriage,  
4 therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary  
5 for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1     Notwithstanding the provisions of section thirty-nine of chap-  
2 ter two hundred and seven of the General Laws, the state secre-  
3 tary may authorize in the manner set forth under said section  
4 thirty-nine, the solemnization of a marriage by David J. Ferrucci,  
5 as he is an attorney in Westbrook, Maine, on August fifteenth,  
6 nineteen hundred and eighty-seven, in the town of Montague,  
7 between Barbara L. Jacque and William C. McMurray, Jr., both  
8 of the city of Newton, and the state secretary shall issue to said  
9 David J. Ferrucci in his capacity as aforesaid a certification of  
10 such authorization.
