AN ACT REQUIRING TATTOOISTS TO BE QUALIFIED PHYSICIANS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 265 of the General Laws is hereby amended by in-
2 serting after section 14 the following section:—

3 *Section 14A.* Whoever, not being registered as a qualified
4 physician under section two of chapter one hundred and twelve
5 or corresponding provisions of earlier laws, tattoos the body of
6 another shall be punished by imprisonment for not more than
7 one year or by a fine of not more than three hundred dollars or
8 both.
