AN ACT

In addition to "An Act providing for the Inspection of
Sole Leather."

1 SEC. 1. **BE** it enacted by the Senate and House
2 of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and
3 by the authority of the same, That the Inspector
4 General of Sole Leather, shall have power to appoint
5 one or more Deputy Inspectors in any town in this
6 Commonwealth, who shall be removable at pleasure,
7 and shall be subject to all the duties and require-
8 ments contained in "an Act providing for the Inspec-
9 tion of Sole Leather," passed March the seventeenth,
10 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred

11 and thirty one ; and so much of said Act as author-
 12 izes the Inspector General to appoint Deputies only
 13 upon the application of the Mayor and Aldermen of
 14 the City of Boston, or of the Selectmen of any Town,
 15 is hereby repealed : *Provided, however,* That the
 16 Deputy Inspectors already appointed in pursuance
 17 of the Act aforesaid, shall hold their offices in the
 18 same manner as if this Act had not passed.
