Hodgkins for legislation to require the distribution of thyroid-blocking agents to help protect citizens from radioactive emissions, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1478) of Christopher J. Hodgkins relative to the disclosure of medical records of nuclear power plant workers, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3532) of Albert Herren relative to the establishment of a division of nuclear facility safety within the Department of Public Safety, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3541) of Albert Herren relative to the disclosure of medical records of nuclear power plant workers, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3546) of Albert Herren and Daniel J. Valianti for legislation to reduce energy expenditures of cities, towns and the Commonwealth by encouraging the development of cogeneration facilities at public facilities, the petition (acompanied by bill, House, No. 3548) of Albert Herren for legislation to require the distribution of thyroid-blocking agents to help protect citizens from radioactive emissions, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3570) of Albert Herren and Daniel J. Valianti for legislation to require certain power generating facilities to be equipped with co-generation capabilities, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3718) of Barbara Hildt, Christopher J. Hodgkins, Stanley C. Rosenberg and Carmen D. Buell relative to clarifying and improving radiological emergency response planning

for licensed and operating nuclear power plants, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3885) of Thomas G. Palumbo for legislation to require local approval of radiological emergency response plans, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3886) of Thomas G. Palumbo for legislation to clarify and improve the Governor's authority in radiological emergency response planning and to improve monitoring for licensed and operating nuclear power plants, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 5028) of Carmen D. Buell and Stanley C. Rosenberg for legislation to further regulate the Yankee Atomic Nuclear Power Plant in the town of Rowe, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5400) ought to be adopted.

7 of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,
8 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such
9 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk
10 of the House of Representatives on or before the last Wednesday
11 in December, nineteen hundred and ninety-two.
