**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty.

**AN ACT PROVIDING FOR REIMBURSEMENT BY THE COMMONWEALTH OF PART OF THE COST TO CITIES AND TOWNS OF GENERAL RELIEF.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 117 of the General Laws is hereby amended by  
2 inserting after section 19 the following new section: —  
3 *Section 19A.* Each town shall be reimbursed by the common-  
4 wealth for one half of all sums expended or paid by it under  
5 this chapter after July first, nineteen hundred and sixty for the  
6 relief or support of persons lawfully settled therein and also  
7 one half of all sums expended or paid by it after said July first  
8 in administering this chapter. All accounts against the common-  
9 wealth for allowances to towns on account of moneys paid for  
10 which they are entitled to reimbursement by the commonwealth  
11 hereunder shall be rendered to the department of public welfare  
12 on forms prescribed by said department, and, if rendered as  
13 aforesaid, approved by said department and certified by the  
14 comptroller, but not otherwise, shall be paid by the common-  
15 wealth from such funds as may be appropriated therefor. The  
16 approval of accounts by said department under this chapter  
17 shall have the effect of a provisional pre-audit of such accounts,  
18 and reimbursements based thereon shall be subject to verifica-  
19 tion and adjustment by said department. Such adjustments  
20 shall be made by reducing or increasing any subsequent reim-  
21 bursements under this chapter by the amount of such  
22 adjustment.
