RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO AN EXERCISE FACILITY FOR THE MEMBERS AND STAFF OF THE GENERAL COURT.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission, to consist of two members
2 of the senate; two members of the house of representatives; and five
3 persons to be appointed by the governor, one of whom shall be a
4 registered physician, one of whom shall be a qualified practicing
5 nutritionist or dietician, and three of whom shall be persons with
6 experience and knowledge in related health care fields, is hereby
7 established for the purpose of making an investigation and study
8 relative to the feasibility of providing an exercise facility for the
9 members and staff of the general court. Said commission shall
10 report to the general court the result of its investigation and study
11 and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation
12 necessary to carry said recommendations into effect, by filing the
13 same with the clerk of the house of representatives on or before the
14 first Wednesday in December, nineteen hundred and eighty-seven.
