AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TERMS OF THE BOARD MEMBERS OF THE BOARD
OF REGISTRATION OF ALLIED HEALTH PROFESSIONS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General
Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 11A of chapter 13 of the Massachusetts General Laws,
2 as appearing in the 1988 Official Edition, is hereby amended by
3 inserting after the second paragraph, the following paragraph: —
4 Of the board members appointed to the term commencing
5 January 6, 1992, one athletic trainer, one occupational therapist
6 and one physical therapist shall be appointed for a period of one
7 year; one athletic trainer, one occupational therapist, one physical
8 therapist and the physician member shall be appointed for a
9 period of two years; one athletic trainer, the physical therapist
10 assistant, the occupational therapist assistant and the public
11 member shall be appointed for a period of three years. All
12 subsequent appointments shall be for a period of three years, in
13 accordance with the provisions of this section.
