AN ACT ESTABLISHING "GOOD FRIDAY" AS A LEGAL HOLIDAY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Clause eighteenth of section 7 of chapter 4 of the General
2 Laws, as most recently amended by section 2 of chapter 99
3 of the acts of 1955, is hereby further amended by inserting
4 after the word "twenty-second", in line two, as appearing in
5 chapter 190 of the acts of 1946, the words: — Good Friday.
