AN ACT PROVIDING FOR PREFERENTIAL TREATMENT TO RESIDENTS AND TAXPAYERS OF THE COMMONWEALTH IN THE ASSIGNMENT OF KENNELS AT DOG RACE MEETINGS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 128A is hereby amended by inserting after section 9A
2 the following section:—

3 *Section 9B.* The state racing commission is hereby autho-
4 rized and directed, acting under the powers conferred upon it
5 by section nine of chapter one hundred and twenty-eight A of
6 the General Laws, to require that the kennels assigned in con-
7 junction with conducting the pari-mutuel system at dog racing
8 meetings shall be assigned to resident taxpayers of the com-
9 monwealth; provided, that the dog meet the minimum rule or
10 standards established by the proper officials of the trade.
