AN ACT DESIGNATING THE BRIDGE OVER THE CONNECTICUT RIVER  
BETWEEN THE CITY OF HOLYOKE AND THE TOWN OF SOUTH HADLEY  
AS THE SERGEANT JOSEPH E. MULLER BRIDGE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 The bridge being constructed across the Connecticut river,
- 2 between the city of Holyoke and the town of South Hadley,
- 3 shall, upon its completion, be known and designated as the
- 4 Sergeant Joseph E. Muller bridge. The department of public
- 5 works shall erect a suitable plaque bearing said designation.
