AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION BY THE PORT OF BOSTON AUTHORITY OF SHORE PROTECTION IN THE CITY OF QUINCY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The Port of Boston Authority is hereby authorized
2 and directed to construct approximately three thou-
3 sand linear feet of granite shore protection along the
4 beach in the city of Quincy between the site of the
5 Nut Island sewage elimination project and a point
6 north of the Quincy yacht club, between Thomas and
7 Bird streets and between St. Germain street on the
8 Town river and a point two hundred and fifty feet
9 beyond the Weymouth sewer opening. For said
10 purposes, said authority may expend sums, not ex-
11 ceeding, in the aggregate, eighty thousand dollars, of
12 which amount one half shall be paid by the common-
13 wealth subject to appropriation, and one half shall
14 be contributed by the city of Quincy.
