## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eleven.

### AN ACT

Relative to retiring Employees of the Commonwealth in Certain Cases.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Any employee in any of the departments  
2 of the commonwealth who was in the public service on  
3 the first day of January, nineteen hundred and eleven,  
4 and has served continuously for not less than forty-five  
5 years, and has arrived at the age of seventy years, may,  
6 with the approval of the governor, be retired by the head  
7 of the department in which he is employed, with an an-  
8 nuity of not less than fifty per cent of the salary paid  
9 him at the time of his said retirement: *provided*, that a  
10 head of a department may continue such employee in the  
11 service beyond the age limit named in this act so long as  
12 it may be for the interest of the public service so to retain  
13 him.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
