AN ACT TO PREVENT THE SALE OF IMPURE ICE.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows :

State board of health to examine concerning sale of impure ice.

SECTION 1. Upon complaint in writing of not less than twenty-five consumers of ice which is cut, sold and held for sale from any pond or stream in this Commonwealth, alleging that said ice is impure and injurious to health, the state board of health may appoint a time and place for hearing parties to be affected and give due notice thereof to such parties, and after such hearing said board may make such orders concerning the sale of said ice as in its judgment the public health requires.

Orders of board may be enforced by injunction.

SECTION 2. The supreme judicial court in term time or vacation may issue an injunction to enforce such orders of the state board.

Parties aggrieved may appeal to a jury.

SECTION 3. Such orders of the state board of health shall be served upon any person or persons who are or have been selling said impure ice and any party aggrieved thereby shall have the right of appeal to a jury and be subject to the provisions of sections eighty-eight, eighty-nine and ninety of chapter eighty of the Public Statutes, and the court may render such judgment as to costs as in its discretion may seem just. *Approved June 16, 1886.*

Name changed.

SECTION 1. The name of the South Pocasset Cemetery Association is changed to Cataumet Cemetery Association.
