AN ACT REGULATING GAMES OF WHIST, BRIDGE OR FOR SALE OF  
TICKETS, CHANCES OR RAFFLES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as  
follows:*

- 1 Section 22A of chapter 271 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended so that said section will read as follows:—
- 3 *Section 22A.* Whist or bridge for charitable and similar
- 4 purposes. Nothing in this chapter shall authorize the prose-
- 5 cution, arrest or conviction of any person for conducting or
- 6 promoting, or for allowing to be conducted or promoted a
- 7 game of cards commonly called whist or bridge or for the sale
- 8 of chances, tickets or raffles in connection with which prizes
- 9 are offered to be won by chance; provided, that the entire
- 10 proceeds of the charges for admission to such game or
- 11 chances, tickets or raffles are donated solely to charitable,
- 12 civic, educational, fraternal or religious purposes.
