**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Four.

**AN ACT IMPOSING A MANDATORY SENTENCE OF FIVE YEARS FOR  
COMMITTING A FELONY WHILE ARMED.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law, whoever  
2 commits an offense which may be punished by imprisonment  
3 in the state prison for more than two and a half years while  
4 armed with a firearm shall, in addition to the penalty for such  
5 offense, be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for  
6 five years, which sentence shall not be suspended, nor shall  
7 such person be parolled prior to the expiration of five years,  
8 nor shall such person earn from such sentence deductions for  
9 good conduct while in prison.

By the Senate of the State of New York, in regular session, held at the Capitol, Albany, on the 15th day of January, 1881, the following resolution was adopted:

AN ACT TO AMEND THE SEVERAL SECTIONS OF THE SEVERAL ACTS RELATIVE TO THE OFFICE OF THE COMMISSIONER OF THE LAND OFFICE.

Enacted by the Senate and Assembly of the State of New York, in regular session, held at the Capitol, Albany, on the 15th day of January, 1881, the following resolution was adopted:

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law, whenever
2. occurs an office which may be created by appointment,
3. in the state papers for more than one year and a half years, with
4. attached with a business of such nature as to require for each
5. office be created by appointment in the state papers for
6. the year, which position shall not be vacated, but shall
7. and remain be created for the expiration of the year,
8. the state papers from such position shall not be
9. vacant until the expiration of the year.
