AN ACT PLACING THE POSITION OF LABOR MANAGEMENT AGENT OF THE PORT OF BOSTON AUTHORITY UNDER THE CIVIL SERVICE LAWS AND RULES.

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would
2 tend to defeat its purpose, which is to place forthwith
3 the position specified therein under the civil service
4 laws and rules, therefore it is hereby declared to be
5 an emergency law, necessary for the immediate pres-
6 ervation of the public convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 The position of labor management agent of the Port
2 of Boston Authority shall, upon the effective date of
3 this act, become subject to the civil service laws and
4 rules, and the term of office of any incumbent thereof
5 shall be unlimited, subject, however, to said laws, but
6 the incumbent of said position on said effective date
7 shall be subjected to a qualifying examination by the
8 director of civil service, and if he passes said examina-
9 tion he shall be certified for said position and shall be
10 deemed to be permanently appointed thereto without
11 being required to serve any probationary period.
