## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-Two.

### AN ACT RELATIVE TO PROTECTING PUBLIC EMPLOYEES AGAINST INJURY AND DEATH.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 149 of the General Laws, is hereby amended by  
2 inserting after section 38, the following section: —

3 *Section 38A.* That all Employees of the cities and towns of  
4 the commonwealth be placed under the provisions of chapter  
5 one hundred and forty-nine of the General Laws.

purpose of promoting public copyright legislation.

The Constitution of the Association

Article I. Name and Purpose.

Section 1. This Association shall be known as the National Copyright Association, and its purpose shall be to promote the interests of authors, publishers, and editors in the United States.

Section 2. The Association shall have the honor and respect of a national organization, and shall be organized in accordance with the laws of the United States.

Section 3. The Association shall have the right to sue and be sued, to acquire, hold, and dispose of real and personal property, and to do all such other acts and things as may be necessary or proper for the accomplishment of its purposes.
