

By Mr. Danovitch of Norwood, petition of Alan Paul Danovitch for increasing the amount of real property of blind persons to be exempted from taxation and establishing a flat exemption of a certain sum of money due for taxes of such persons. Taxation.

AN ACT INCREASING THE AMOUNT OF REAL PROPERTY OF BLIND PERSONS TO BE EXEMPTED FROM TAXATION AND ESTABLISHING A FLAT EXEMPTION OF A SUM OF MONEY DUE FOR TAXES OF BLIND PERSONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 5 of chapter 59 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking out clause Thirty-seventh, as most
3 recently amended by chapter 615 of the acts of 1965 and in-
4 serting in place thereof the following clause: —

5 Thirty-seventh, Real property, to the amount of three thou-
6 sand dollars or the sum of two hundred and sixty-two dollars
7 and fifty cents taxes due, whichever is greater, of a blind person
8 who is a legal resident of the commonwealth, whether such
9 property be owned by him individually, jointly, or as tenant in
10 common; provided, that such property is occupied by such as
11 his domicile, and provided; further, that the total assessed value
12 of all real property owned by such persons individually, jointly,
13 or as a tenant in common, does not exceed twenty-five thousand
14 dollars.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect as of January first,
2 nineteen hundred and sixty-nine and shall apply to taxes assessed
3 in said year and subsequent years.
