## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Nine.

### AN ACT RELATIVE TO POSTING OF SENIORITY LISTS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 15C of chapter 31 of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by striking out paragraph 2 and inserting the  
3 following new paragraph:—

4 Every such appointing officer shall cause a copy of such  
5 list signed by him to be posted forthwith for inspection in  
6 a prominent place in any area of any division or department  
7 where five or more employees begin their tour of duty on or  
8 before May first in the year in which the list of officers and  
9 employees is compiled. Such list shall be dated as of the  
10 day of posting and shall remain posted for one year from  
11 the date of posting.

**The Commencement of Appropriations**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Six

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TIME OF MAKING OF APPROPRIATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the Senate and House of Representatives, that the following provisions shall have effect:

1. Section 150 of chapter 21 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out paragraph 2 and inserting the following new paragraph:—
2. Every such appropriation officer shall cause a copy of each bill to be sent to the proper authority for preparation in a permanent form in any case of any bill or document where the same is not already in that form at the time and before the first of the year in which the bill or document is introduced in committee. Such bill shall be filed as of the date of printing and shall remain printed for one year from the date of printing.
