AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE LICENSES AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF BEVERAGES CONFORM TO THE FEDERAL REGULATIONS CONCERNING CITIZENSHIP.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 15 of Chapter 138 of the General Laws, as appearing in  
2 Chapter 422 of the Acts of 1973, is hereby amended by striking out  
3 of lines seven through eleven, inclusive, the words: — To appli-  
4 cants therefore who are citizens and residents of the common-  
5 wealth, partnerships, composed solely of such citizens and  
6 residents or to corporations organized under the laws of the com-  
7 monwealth and whereof all directors shall be citizens of the United  
8 States and a majority residents of the commonwealth.
