### AN ACT

Making Appropriations for the Salaries of Employees  
and for other Necessary Expenses in the Department  
of the Sergeant-at-Arms.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned  
2 are appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury  
3 of the Commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue,  
4 for the purposes specified, to meet expenses for  
5 the year ending on the thirty-first day of Decem-  
6 ber in the year nineteen hundred and one, to  
7 wit: —

8 For the salary of the chief engineer and other  
9 employees in the engineer's department, a sum  
10 not exceeding ten thousand two hundred dollars.  
11 [Acts 1895, chap. 284.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$10,200.)

12 For the salaries of the watchmen and assistant  
13 watchmen at the state house, a sum not exceeding

14 eleven thousand one hundred dollars. [Acts  
15 1895, chap. 284.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$11,100.)

16 For the salaries of firemen, oilers and cleaners  
17 at the state house, a sum not exceeding ten thou-  
18 sand five hundred dollars. [Acts 1895, chap.  
19 284.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$10,500.)

20 For the salaries of the elevator men and  
21 expenses in connection with the elevators at the  
22 state house, a sum not exceeding sixty-eight hun-  
23 dred dollars. [Acts 1895, chap. 284.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$6,800.)

24 For the salaries of the special messenger and  
25 porters at the state house, a sum not exceeding  
26 five thousand three hundred dollars. [Acts 1895,  
27 chap. 284.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$5,300.)

28 For rent of telephones and expenses in connec-  
29 tion therewith at the state house, a sum not  
30 exceeding fifty-five hundred dollars. [Acts 1895,  
31 chap. 284.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$5,000.)

32 For the fuel and lights at the state house,  
33 including coal, water, gas, and removal of ashes, a  
34 sum not exceeding thirty thousand dollars. [Acts  
35 1895, chap. 284.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$30,000.)

36 For the care of the state house and grounds,  
37 including repairs, furniture and repairs thereof,  
38 and such expenses as may be necessary at the  
39 various buildings now occupied by state depart-

40 ments, a sum not exceeding twenty-five thousand  
41 dollars. [Acts 1895, chap. 284.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$25,000.)

42 For new furniture and fixtures, a sum not  
43 exceeding five thousand dollars. [Acts 1895,  
44 chap. 284.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$5,000.)

45 For the salary of the messengers to the ser-  
46 geant-at-arms known as "sergeant-at-arms mes-  
47 sengers," including an office boy, a sum not  
48 exceeding forty-two hundred dollars. [Res. 1896,  
49 chap. 205; Acts 1895, Chap. 284.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$4,200.)

50 For incidental and contingent expenses of the  
51 sergeant-at-arms, and expense of mailing legisla-  
52 tive bulletins, a sum not exceeding four hundred  
53 dollars. [Res. 1856, chap. 74.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$300.)

54 For the salary of the stenographer of the ser-  
55 geant-at-arms, a sum not exceeding nine hundred  
56 dollars. [Acts 1895, chap. 284; Res. 1856, chap.  
57 74.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$800.)

58 For the salary of the state house matron, a sum  
59 not exceeding eight hundred dollars. [Acts 1895,  
60 chap. 284; Res. 1856, chap. 74.]

(Appropriation 1900, \$800.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
