AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE TRANSFER OF PRISONERS FROM ONE CORRECTIONAL FACILITY TO ANOTHER.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 127 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking
2 out section 97, as most recently amended by chapter 627 of the acts
3 of 1968, and inserting in place thereof the following section: —
4 *Section 97.* The commissioner may transfer any sentenced pris-
5 oner from one state correctional facility to another and, with the
6 approval of the sheriff of the county, from any such correctional
7 facility to any county correctional facility to any state correctional
8 facility, or from any county correctional facility to another county
9 correctional facility. Prisoners so removed shall be subject to the
10 terms of their original sentence and to the provisions of law govern-
11 ing parole from the correctional facilities of the commonwealth.
