SENATE No. 1425

By Mr. Reilly, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1425) of Martin T. Reilly for legislation to provide that military service performed by certain employees be counted as creditable service for the purposes of retirement. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-three.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT MILITARY SERVICE PERFORMED BY CERTAIN EMPLOYEES BE COUNTED AS CREDITABLE SERVICE FOR PURPOSES OF RETIREMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Paragraph (h) of subdivision (1) section 4 of Chapter 32
2 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by Chapter
3 671 of the Acts of 1966, is hereby further amended by adding
4 after the third subparagraph, the following new subpara-
5 graph: — Any member who served in the armed services
6 between December seventh, nineteen hundred and forty-one
7 and July first, nineteen hundred and forty-six, and who was
8 honorably discharged, shall have actual service credited to
9 him as creditable service provided that he is a veteran as
10 defined in section (1) having not less than twenty years ac-
11 cumulative service in the commonwealth or any of its politi-
12 cal subdivisions and that he pay into the annuity savings
13 fund of the state retirement system such amounts as he
14 would have contributed during the period of such service, but
15 in no event for more than four years.
