

Chap. 61. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF SOMERVILLE TO GRANT SALARY INCREASES TO THE MEMBERS OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT OF SAID CITY RETROACTIVELY TO JUNE THE FIRST, NINETEEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Notwithstanding any contrary provision of law, the city of Somerville is hereby authorized to appropriate and pay to the members of the fire department of said city, including the chief of said department, the pay raise contained in an ordinance enacted by said city in the year nineteen hundred and seventy, which pay raise shall be retroactive to June the first, nineteen hundred and seventy pursuant to a collective bargaining agreement entered into by said city with the duly recognized bargaining agency of said department. *Approved February 26, 1971.*

Chap. 62. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF SOMERVILLE TO GRANT SALARY INCREASES TO THE MEMBERS OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT RETROACTIVELY TO JUNE THE FIRST, NINETEEN HUNDRED AND SEVENTY.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Notwithstanding any contrary provision of law, the city of Somerville is hereby authorized to appropriate and pay to the members of the police department of said city, including the chief of police, the pay raise contained in an ordinance enacted by said city in the year nineteen hundred and seventy, which pay raise shall be retroactive to June the first, nineteen hundred and seventy pursuant to a collective bargaining agreement entered into by said city with the duly recognized bargaining agency of said department. *Approved February 26, 1971.*

Chap. 63. AN ACT PROVIDING TENURE OF OFFICE UNTIL AGE SIXTY-FIVE FOR GLEN B. CLOUGH, INCUMBENT OF THE OFFICE OF CHIEF ENGINEER OF THE HYANNIS FIRE DISTRICT.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Glen B. Clough, incumbent of the office of chief engineer of the Hyannis Fire District, shall hold said office during good behavior until he reaches age sixty-five, unless incapacitated by physical or mental disability from performing the duties thereof. Said incumbent shall not, prior to reaching said age, be lowered in compensation, suspended or removed, except for just cause after a hearing by the prudential committee and for reasons specifically given him in writing.

Chap. 64. AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE MAXIMUM REMUNERATION FOR CERTAIN CITY AND TOWN CLERKS WHO ARE ALSO MEMBERS OF BOARDS OF REGISTRARS OF VOTERS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 19G of chapter 41 of the General Laws, as amended by chapter 5 of the acts of 1968, is hereby further amended by
