AN ACT RELATIVE TO MOTOR VEHICLE HOMICIDES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 4A of chapter 38 of the General Laws, as
2 appearing in the 1994 Official Edition, is hereby amended by
3 inserting after the word "accident", in line 6, the following: — or
4 the deceased was a pedestrian twelve years of age or older.

1 SECTION 2. Said section 4A of said chapter 38, as so
2 appearing, is hereby further amended by inserting after the word
3 "blood", in line 7, the words: — and a sample of urine.

1 SECTION 3. Section 24G of chapter 90 of the General Laws,
2 as appearing in the 1994 Official Edition, is hereby amended by
3 inserting after the word "substance", in line 10, the following: —
4 shall undergo a breathalyzer test and a urine sample for drug
5 testing at the time of arrest.

1 SECTION 4. Said section 24G of said chapter 90, as so
2 appearing, is hereby further amended by inserting after the word
3 "person", in line 42, the following: — shall undergo a breathalyzer
4 test and submit to a urine sample for drug screening.
