The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Two.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE SALARY OF THE CITY MANAGER
IN THE CITY OF MEDFORD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of sec-
2 tion one hundred and three of chapter forty-three of
3 the General Laws, the annual salary of the city man-
4 ager in the city of Medford shall be seventy-five hun-
5 dred dollars.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted for ac-
2 ceptance to the registered voters of the city of Med-
3 ford at the biennial state election in the current year
4 in the form of the following question, which shall be
5 placed upon the official ballot to be used in said city
6 at said election:—“Shall an act passed by the gen-
7 eral court in the current year providing that the an-
8 nual salary of the city manager of this city shall be
9 seventy-five hundred dollars, be accepted?” If a
10 majority of the votes in answer to said question is in
11 the affirmative, this act shall thereupon take full
12 effect, but not otherwise.
