AN ACT EXEMPTING ANY PUBLIC SAFETY VEHICLE FROM THE SPECIAL FUELS EXCISE TAX.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Chapter 64E of the General Laws is hereby amended by
- 2 inserting after section 5 of the following section: —
- 3 Section 5A. No excise shall be due under this chapter on any
- 4 special fuels which are purchased by any city or town and used
- 5 for Public Safety purposes.
