AN ACT RELATIVE TO PARKING FACILITIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any provision of general or special law to
2 the contrary, no employee of the commonwealth shall be
3 charged a fee for the use of parking facilities on any land
4 owned by the Commonwealth located at the site of their
5 employment.
