AN ACT AMENDING THE EDUCATIONAL REFORM LAW.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Section 12 of the Acts of 1985 is hereby amended in Section
- 2 2 by adding at the end of the first paragraph the following: —
- 3 “Provided further that 10% of the equal education opportunity
- 4 grant provided by the Chapter, and 10% of the local matching
- 5 funds for said grant may be expended for capital needs directly
- 6 related to education. Said capital needs shall include equipment,
- 7 plant maintenance and similar items.”
