## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

AN ACT EXTENDING THE TIME WITHIN WHICH CERTAIN SOLDIERS AND SAILORS AND THEIR WIVES, WIDOWS, FATHERS OR MOTHERS MAY FILE APPLICATION FOR ABATEMENT OR EXEMPTION OF TAXES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 534 of the acts of 1949 is hereby amended by strik-  
2 ing out section 3, as most recently amended by chapter 9 of  
3 the acts of 1961, and inserting in place thereof the following  
4 section:—

5 *Section 3.* Application for abatement or exemption, as pro-  
6 vided in sections one and two, of taxes levied in the year nine-  
7 teen hundred and sixty-one may be made not later than October  
8 first, nineteen hundred and sixty-two, notwithstanding any pro-  
9 vision of law to the contrary.
