AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF AN AIRPORT ON THE ISLAND OF CUTTYHUNK IN THE TOWN OF GOSNOLD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The department of public works is hereby au-
2 thorized and directed to construct an airport on the
3 island of Cuttyhunk in the town of Gosnold at a
4 cost not exceeding twelve thousand dollars; pro-
5 vided, that no work shall be begun hereunder until
6 there has been paid into the state treasury by the
7 county of Dukes county the sum of two thousand
8 dollars and by the town of Gosnold the sum of one
9 thousand dollars, nor until federal funds in the amount
10 of six thousand dollars are available therefor, which
11 sums, in addition to three thousand dollars to be
12 paid by the commonwealth, subject to appropriation,
13 shall constitute a fund to meet the cost of the work
14 hereby provided for.
