AN ACT

Relative to the Maintenance of Rocks Bridge
over the Merrimac River between the City of
Haverhill and the Town of West Newbury.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section one of chapter one hun-
2 dred and twenty-five of the acts of the year eigh-
3 teen hundred and ninety-seven is hereby amended
4 so as to read as follows:

5 *Section 1.* The town of Amesbury shall be
6 hereafter relieved of all charges on account of
7 Rocks bridge. The county commissioners of Essex
8 county shall, within three months from June first
9 in the year nineteen hundred proceed to reapportion
10 the cost of maintenance of said bridge upon such
11 cities and towns other than said town of Amesbury
13 as receive direct and specific benefit from the use of

14 said bridge; and, if they deem it equitable, such
15 portion of said cost and expense as they deem
16 proper upon the county of Essex.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
