Lane, Matthew J. Amorello, Erving H. Wall, Jr., and Mary S. Rogeness for legislation relative to the penalty for the possession of child pornography materials, the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 176) of Linda J. Melconian for legislation relative to the penalty for the theft of medical records or medical information, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 519) of Robert A. Antonioni relative to the use of facsimile checks, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 704) of Patricia A. Walrath and other members of the General Court for legislation to provide penalties for persons convicted of crimes against farm property, livestock or crops, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2241) of Peter I. Blute for legislation to further regulate the use of shopping carts, laundry carts, dairy cases, dispenser cases, egg baskets, poultry boxes and certain other containers, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3136) of Larry F. Giordano for legislation to further regulate the use of shopping carts, laundry carts, dairy cases, dispenser cases, egg baskets, poultry boxes and certain other containers, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5590) ought to be adopted.

1 *Ordered*, That the committee on Criminal Justice be
2 authorized during the recess of the General Court to make an
3 investigation and study of Senate documents numbered 140, 163
4 and 176 and House documents numbered 519, 704, 2241 and 3136,
5 relative to hypodermic needles, child pornography, theft of
6 medical records, facsimile checks, destroying farm property and
7 the use of certain containers.

8 Said committee shall report to the General Court the results
9 of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,
10 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such
11 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk
12 of the House of Representatives on or before the last Wednesday
13 in December, nineteen hundred and ninety-two.
