

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, July 23, 1958.

The committee on Ways and Means, to whom was recommitted the Bill relative to the administration and personnel of the Lowell Technological Institute of Massachusetts (House, No. 890, changed) and to whom were referred so much of the address of His Excellency the Governor recommending certain measures to provide increased opportunities for employment (Senate, No. 660), as relates to an increase in the Commonwealth's guarantee for the construction of housing projects for elderly persons, and as relates to providing state assistance to local communities for urban renewal projects; the Bill further regulating the compensation of state employees required to work on holidays, or on whose day off a holiday falls (printed as Senate, No. 120); the Bill relative to overtime work and compensation therefor for certain persons employed by the Commonwealth (printed as Senate, No. 121); the Bill authorizing the Department of Education to acquire certain land in the city of Fitchburg for the purpose of erecting a building thereon for the State Teachers College at Fitchburg, and authorizing the preparation of plans for said building (Senate, No. 160); the Bill providing for an appropriation of funds to complete the original plans for the new science building at the New Bedford Institute of Technology (printed as Senate, No. 298); the Bill providing for the purchase of certain properties adjacent to the New Bedford Institute of Technology by the trustees thereof (printed as Senate, No. 299); the Bill authorizing the trustees of the New Bedford Institute of Technology to acquire a certain parcel of land with the buildings thereon adjacent to its property in the city of New Bedford (printed as Senate, No. 300); the Bill reimbursing the town of Norfolk for the loss of taxes on certain land therein owned by the Commonwealth and held for public institution purposes (Senate, No. 529); the Bill to provide for the allocation of all officers and employees of the Com-

monwealth to the general salary schedule in effect October first, nineteen hundred and fifty-six (House, No. 335); the Bill to correct certain inequities in the fixing of salaries for state employees (House, No. 783); the Bill authorizing and directing the Department of Education to build a dormitory area for women at the State Teachers' College at Lowell (House, No. 1865); the Resolve providing for an investigation and study by a special commission of the licensing, regulation and operation of so-called automatic amusement devices (House, No. 1992); the Bill authorizing the trustees of the Bradford Durfee Technical Institute of Fall River to construct and originally equip an engineering building and a student union building and to acquire land therefor (House, No. 2372); the Bill providing for partial reimbursement of approved regional planning districts (House, No. 2754); the Bill establishing an advisory committee for the Department of Mental Health (House, No. 2760); the Bill to provide a cost-of-living salary increase for certain officers and employees of the Commonwealth and for certain blind workers (House, No. 2893); the special report of the Commissioner of Administration (under authority of Section 7 of Chapter 7 of the General Laws, as amended by Chapter 610 of the Acts of 1948) recommending an amendment of the act providing for a capital outlay program relative to the heating system and other improvements at the farm dormitory at the Massachusetts Correctional Institution, Norfolk (House, No. 2668); the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 362) of Samuel Pinanski and Cornelius F. Kiernan that provision be made for an emergency capital outlay program to cover the cost of certain improvements at the Lowell Technological Institute of Massachusetts, report the accompanying order (House, No. 3188).

Ordered, That the House committee on Ways and Means shall include in the investigation and study of the finances of the commonwealth the subject matter of current senate document numbered 120, further regulating the compensation of state employees required to work on holidays, or on whose day off a holiday falls; of current senate document numbered 121, relative to overtime work and compensation therefor for certain persons employed by the commonwealth; of current senate document numbered 160, authorizing the department of education to acquire certain land in the city of Fitchburg for the purpose of erecting a building thereon for the state teachers college at Fitchburg, and authorizing the preparation of plans for said building; of current senate document numbered 298, providing for an appropriation of funds to complete the original plans for the new science building at the New Bedford Institute of Technology; of current senate document numbered 299, providing for the purchase of certain properties adjacent to the New Bedford Institute of Technology by the trustees thereof; of current senate document numbered 300, authorizing the trustees of the New Bedford Institute of Technology to acquire a certain parcel of land with the buildings thereon adjacent to its property in the city of New Bedford; of current senate document numbered 529, reimbursing the town of Norfolk for the loss of taxes on certain land therein owned by the commonwealth and held for public institution purposes; so much of the address of His Excellency the Governor recommending certain measures to provide increased opportunities for employment (Senate, No. 660), as relates to an increase in the Commonwealth's guarantee for the construction of housing projects for elderly persons and as relates to providing state assistance to local communities for urban renewal projects; of current house document numbered 335, to provide for the allocation of all officers and employees of the Commonwealth to the general salary schedule in effect October first, nineteen hundred and fifty-six; of current house document numbered 362, to provide for an emergency capital outlay program for the commonwealth; of current house document numbered 783, to correct certain inequities in the fixing of salaries
